SAINT TO SAINT... The Gifts of God Made Manifest

A recent article in the Richmond *Times-Dispatch* described the rise once again of panning for gold in the streams of the Sierra foothills in Northern California. While the bulk of the mother

lode was exhausted in the 1850's, the recent Sierra snowmelt is supplying lots of water for stirring up bits of gold for the patient to try to discover in their pans and screens. One successor to the Gold rushers of '49, in the article, who found a gold nugget slightly smaller than a pea exclaimed, "This is what's it's all about!"

The excitement and satisfaction that comes with finding unexpected treasure is a human experience that spans ages and cultures. It is found in rushing freshwater streams but also, thankfully, in the small church! I've had the privilege of both being a member of and serving in congregations of a variety of sizes over the years. In the large church, due to its size, there are often many gifted people to help out.

Sign-up sheets fill up fast. Need a retiree present to be available for day ministry? They're there. Younger, physically strong folks to do some hard labor? Just call. Looking for a techie to staff social media? The youth are raising their hands.

In the small church, however, by definition, not all age and skill and gift groups are represented and yet the Lord provides... and the small church thrives. Laurel has so many of these "gold nuggets" of giftedness that thrill and inspire me that it would be folly for me to start naming all of them here, but some recent events and the individuals that made them successful need to be recognized.

I think, for instance, of the renovation of the bathroom plumbing, the need for which has been years in the making. We were initially presented with a bid for \$30,000 plus which was approved

by the Session. Pete Rose believed it could be done differently, divided into skill sets, with different crews hired for specific projects, and importantly, more cheaply. Several weeks later, indeed, the renovation was completed, under \$20,000 with Pete's leadership, with several others like Marshall Chamberlayne lending their guidance. A separate article recognizes their efforts.

The recent purchase of new sound equipment to upgrade our aging system necessitated the expansion of our existing sound booth. How would it be done? How much would it cost? Who could do it? Hiring professionals was out of the question. Our gold nuggets here came in the form of Steve Scearce, Duane Berger and Reggie Fitch, and Marshall Chamberlayne again as our electrician. What they thought was a kind of weekend DIY project turned into an enterprise requiring full days of preparation and woodworking. The result is outstanding, like a piece of fine furniture, which should serve our needs for years to come.

The right people in the right place at the right time might be one definition of the providence of the Lord. But, of course, it doesn't stop with construction. Those who organize our social events, who serve and comfort our ill and disabled members, who inspire us with their music and grow us through their teaching..., precious nuggets all that the Lord has sent our way!

The Apostle Paul summed it up this way, "The Spirit has given each of us a special way of serving others." (1 Cor. 12:7)

Oops! Did he say "each of us?"
Then there's really lots of gold in "them thar pews!" It's just a matter of exposing it to the light of day! I guess with God, it's always happily a matter of raising one's expectations.



From the Stewardship & Property Team

I would like to take this opportunity to provide a short narrative of the extensive work completed during the restroom project. Over many years, we have had numerous calls to clean out the sewer line in order to keep the restrooms operable for our church, the FRC church, and Gingerbread pre-school. At the beginning of 2017, it became evident the church was facing a major maintenance problem concerning the sewer system. Pete Rose scheduled a plumber with a camera to look at the pipe and discovered the pipe had become partially disconnected at a joint due to deterioration. Pete sprang into action to secure bids for the replacement of pipes during

the summer months. Only one contractor submitted a bid in the amount of \$30,000. When Pete realized the bid did not include all the work required to successfully complete the project, he came up with another plan. First, he enlisted Dennis Wright to come in and remove all the stalls and fixtures and store them in the garage. He then coordinated the work in the evenings by personnel from the Pete Rose Company to jack hammer the concrete and excavate down to the pipe. Once he had access to the pipe, the Carroll Plumbing and Heating Co. came in to replace the pipe and reconnect all the drain connections from each restroom. The plumber also repaired some existing plumbing in the wall that had been leaking. After that phase was completed, C. A. Branson Inc. came in to fill and pour concrete. Dennis replaced the stalls, and the plumber returned to install the toilets and sinks. Dennis then painted the restrooms and installed replacement tile to complete the initial phase of the project. The next phase calls for the replacement of the cabinets, sinks, and vanity tops in the women's restroom over the Christmas break. The final cost of the project, to our balance sheet, should be less than \$15,000 when taking into account the \$5,000 grant we received from the Presbytery of the James. We owe a great deal of thanks to Pete (and Barbara) for spending countless (and I'm sure stressful) hours on this project.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Bob Anderson, with the assistance of Peter Coulson, for coordinating the project of painting the sanctuary. The successful bid was from Coastal Painting for \$7,475. The project was started on Monday, August 14th and completed on Thursday the 17th. No one can remember the exact date when the sanctuary was last painted but it was really overdue. The money for this project came from the Berk McDermott Memorial Funds and had been approved by the family. I would also like to add that the sanctuary was cleaned by a group from the FRC church. When they were in Saturday morning to set up for special services on Saturday and Sunday, they noticed a fine mist of paint overspray in the sanctuary even though everything had been covered by the painting company. They dusted, vacuumed, and moved furniture from the hall to the sanctuary. As Pete MacRae said - "a fine example of team work".
